#### **RADON TESTING KITS**

The Northeast District Department of Health (NDDH) encourages homeowners to "Plan a Raid on Radon." To help homeowners, the NDDH is offering a limited supply of Free Radon testing kits and educational materials. Visit the Health Department on 69 South Main Street in Brooklyn, CT or call the NDDH at 860-774-7350 to get your kit; NDDH is unable to reserve kits or to mail them. The kits can also be purchased at a local hardware store or from the American Lung Association by calling 1/800-586-4872 or by visiting www.lung.org.

#### COVID TEST KITS AND FUNERAL ASSISTANCE

The Renter's Rebate Program filing dates for 2023 are April 1, through October 1. If you are a Renter in Plainfield, Moosup, Wauregan, or Central Village you need to apply (every year) at the Plainfield Town Hall, Assessor's Office 860-230-3008. You will need the amount you paid for rent in 2022, your electricity and heat amounts for 2022, and your total income for 2022.
