Monthly Book Review The Judge's List

The Judge's List by John Grisham

In The Whistler, Lacy Stoltz investigated a corrupt judge who was taking millions in bribes from a crime syndicate. She put the criminals away, but only after being attacked and nearly killed. Three years later, and approaching forty, she is tired of her work for the Florida Board of Judicial Conduct and ready for a change. Then she meets a mysterious woman who is so frightened she uses a number of aliases. Jeri Crosby's father was murdered twenty years earlier in a case that remains unsolved and that has grown stone cold. But Jeri has a suspect whom she has become obsessed with and has stalked for two decades. Along the way, she discovered other victims. He is a judge, in Florida—under Lacy's jurisdiction. He has a list, with the names of his victims and targets, all unsuspecting people unlucky enough to have crossed his path and wronged him in some way. How can Lacy pursue him, without becoming the next name on his list?

The Judge's List is by any measure John Grisham's most surprising, chilling novel yet.

<u>A number of Connecticut laws took effect on October 1st, 2025</u> 3 new laws pertaining to Traffic and Motor Vehicles are:

Stricter reckless driving laws: Penalties are increased for drivers caught going over 100mph, with fines ranging from \$200 to \$600 for the first offense.

Towing reform: An overhaul of towing statutes now requires Tow Companies to take additional steps to notify vehicle owners and accept credit cards. Vehicles generally cannot be towed from private property without notice unless they are blocking traffic or are in a handicapped spot.

E-Bike Regulations: For class 3 E-Bikes (up to 28mph), riders under 16 are banned and all riders must wear a helmet. Higher-powered E-Bikes require a driver's license, registration, and insurance.

For Seniors signed up and approved for **Energy Assistance**, the 1st day for deliverable fuels to be delivered is Monday, November 3rd, 2025. Call the ACCESS Agency to apply for this program at 860-412-1600. Find out if you can get help paying for your heating costs this coming winter.

With Identity theft unfortunately now being very common, keep only the essentials in your wallet. Clean out and sort through everything you carry. According to AARP, these are the 15 Worst things to carry in your wallet: Your Social Security card, Multiple credit cards and credit card receipts, Your checkbook or even 1 blank check, Work ID card, Your Passport, List of your passwords, Gift cards not fully redeemed, Birth Certificate, Library card, house key, Legal paperwork, Checks made out to you, Your PIN number for your credit, debit, or EBT (SNAP) card, Cryptocurrency seed phrase or recovery phrase, Old receipts with the last 4 digits of your credit card on them.

** And remember to only carry your Medicare card when you need it for a Doctor's appointment**

Here are 6 Bad Money Habits to **Break**: Putting expenses on autopilot for payment, Recycling passwords for your online accounts, Constantly checking your investments and making changes, Never checking your investments and return amounts, Chasing credit card sign up promotions, Pinching every penny and never spending your savings. A good idea is to obtain and check in with a Financial Advisor every 6 months. Ask at your bank about this service.
